


TEAM IPSLEY UPDATE!

Happy Friday everyone! Another busy week at Ipsley has flown by!

This week, Year 8 pupils have been exploring themes of injustice, criminality, morality and social class in Oliver by Charles Dickens. Pupils have been looking closely at the text in the English, looking at the different perspectives of the characters, and then, in library, delving deeper into the themes that Charles Dickens has woven through his book. Pupils have really enjoyed the story and produced some excellent work along the way, including some very mature discussions around morality and what makes a person good or bad!

Our first two tutor groups visited the Guru Nanak Gurdwara in Smethwick today and had an incredible time delving deeper into their learning on Sikhism. Pupils had the opportunity to develop their spirituality by connecting with the beauty of the building and the people inside who made it such a warm and welcoming community.
