

## **Online Safety Conference Follow Up**

21st December 2023

Dear Parent/Carer,

We write to you following the hugely successful Online Safety Conference that we delivered on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November in partnership with West Mercia Police and the University of Worcester. With the likelihood that your child(ren) will spend an increased amount of time online over the holiday period, we would ask that you consider the content of this letter carefully.

In School we talk to our children and young people regularly about keeping themselves safe online. We explain to them that there are broadly four categories of risk:

Content: Children and young people may see illegal, inappropriate, or harmful content when

online.

Contact: Risks young people may face when interacting with others online. This includes

child-to-child pressure, child-on-child abuse or adults posing as children with the

intention to groom and exploit young people.

Conduct: The way people behave online. This could include online bullying and

malicious/threatening communications across social media but can also include the

sharing of inappropriate materials such as nude and semi-nude images.

Commerce: Children and young people may be exposed to risks from issues such as online

gambling, inappropriate advertising, phishing, or financial scams.

During the conference West Mercia Police identified three actions that parents/carers could take to reduce the risks that the online world poses to their child(ren):

- 1) Applications Use privacy controls to lockdown your child's account. Prevent applications from openly detailing your child's location.
- 2) Block Adult Content Block adult content by asking your internet provider to do this on your behalf and also block the content directly on devices.
- 3) Communicate talk early and talk often with your child about their online activity, who they are communicating with, what games they like to play etc.

At 56 minutes and 30 seconds in the recording of the conference DC Will Sneddon goes into more detail about how to take some of these actions.
