

What should I do if...

My child is a close contact of, or lives in the same household as, somebody with coronavirus



Your child **must still come to school**. You should book a PCR test for them on <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>, but they should not miss school for this.



My child is positive.



Inform the school and remote learning will be provided for your child's isolation period. Nobody else in your household needs to isolate unless they have tested positive or develop symptoms.

My child has symptoms of coronavirus



Your child **must not come to school**. Inform the school as soon as possible and remote learning will be provided.



Book a PCR test as soon as possible on <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>.



My child is negative.



Your child must attend school as normal.

My child has tested positive for coronavirus



Your child **must not come to school**. If your child has tested positive on a lateral flow test, you should book a PCR test for them using <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test> to confirm the result.



Inform the school and remote learning will be provided for your child's isolation period. Nobody else in your household needs to isolate unless they have tested positive or develop symptoms.

What are covid symptoms?

Your child should isolate and get a PCR test if they have any of the following main symptoms:

A dry, persistent cough

A loss of or change to your sense of taste and/or smell

A temperature above 37.8 degrees.

If anybody in your household is symptomatic or positive, your child should isolate if they have any of the following symptoms:

Sore throat

Headache

Fatigue

Aches/pains

Diarrhoea

Vomiting

Cold-like symptoms

Nobody in your household needs to isolate unless they develop symptoms or test positive.

If anybody in your household tests positive, it is strongly advised that you all go for a PCR test but that no pupils miss school for this.
